BULLDOGS AT A GLANCE

Union is making its first-ever appearance in the NAIA World Series. Union is 47-16 overall, making the fourth year in a row the team has posted 40 or more wins.

Offensively, the team is batting .332 (633 hits in 1,906 at bats) and scored 524 runs in 62 games, averaging 8.45 runs per game. Union set program records with 301 walks and being hit 100 times this season. Union boasts a .441 on-base percentage. On the base paths, Union has stolen 197 bases in 227 attempts - one shy of the program record of 198 set just last season.

On the mound, Union owns a 3.74 earned-run average and has thrown a program-record 11 shutouts this season. In 474.0 innings pitched, Union has given up 197 earned runs while striking out 350 and walking 150. The team has 117 complete games.

POPHAM'S MASTERY ON THE MOUND

Junior right-hander Marty Popham has put together a season of the ages, arguably one of the best in Union baseball history. The Louisville, Ky. native is 16-1 with a 2.03 ERA in 17 appearances

and 17 games starts. Of the team's 17 complete games, Popham has 12.

Popham has set or tied six single-season records this season and one career mark.

The records are:

- Most wins in a season (16)
- Most games started in a season (17)
- Most complete games in a season (12)
- Most shutouts in a season (3)
- Most shutouts in a career (4)
- Most strikeouts in a season (124)
- Most innings pitched in a season (115.1)

CAREER YEAR FOR GRINSTEAD

Junior shortstop Joe Grinstead is having a breakout season for the Bulldogs in 2008. Entering the NAIA World Series, he is batting .430 with 16 doubles, 3 triples, 10 home runs and 57 RBIs. In addition, the Bowling Green, Ky. native has set the single-season record for runs scored (74) and has tied the single-season mark for stolen bases (46).

To see how big of a season Grinstead is having, one only needs to look at two statistics: home runs and RBIs. During his first two seasons (105 games played), Grinstead had 3 home runs and 52 RBIs. But he has eclipsed those numbers in 2008.

KYSAR TRIPLING HIS PLEASURE

After nearly setting the single-season triples record in 2007, junior center fielder Kenny Kysar set the career triples record this season. Currently, the Corbin, Ky. native has 15 triples for his career - 5 this season, besting the old mark of 12 which was held by Tim Moore.

In the NAIA Region XII Tournament championship round, Kysar became just the second player in program history to line two triples in a game as he roped two against Tennessee Wesleyan College in an 8-4 victory on May 10. Chris Beggs also had two triples in a game, accomplishing the feat against Berea (Ky.) College in 1998.

HART: A DOUBLES MACHINE

Senior catcher Justin Hart has always had a knack for lining a double. Twice in his career, the Lake Mary, Fla. native has reeled 20 two-baggers in a season. Earlier this season, Hart became the program's career leader in doubles and currently has 54 to his credit. The previous mark was held by Tim Moore who had 48.

A NEW RBI LEADER?

Senior catcher Justin Hart is closing in on another program record - most RBIs in a career. Currently, Hart has 176 RBIs to his credit, 2 shy of Jeremy Smith's career total of 178.

Should Hart get the record, he will likely not hold it for very long. Junior right fielder Josh Ehringer is hot on his heels with 167 RBIs during his tenure.

McALPIN COMING UP CLUTCH

Senior catcher/designated hitter Brett McAlpin has had an up-and-down season. But life was good for the Winchester, Ky. native during the 2008 South Central Super Regional.

During the three-game series against Cumberland (Tenn.) University, McAlpin batted .583 (7 hits in 12 at bats) had two doubles and drove in 5 RBIs. To top it off, McAlpin even stole a base.

His performance is just a carryover from what he did in the region tournament. In those 9 games, McAlpin owns a .389 average with 4 doubles and 11 RBIs. On the season, McAlpin has had three 3-RBI games with all coming in the postseason. In 40 games played this season, he is batting .330 with 8 doubles, 2 home runs and 18 RBIs.

BALANCED SCORING THREAT

Union has a fairly balanced attack at the plate when it comes time to drive in a run. There are 5 Bulldogs with 50 or more RBIs, 1 with 46 RBIs, another with 39 and one with 31.

Meanwhile, Union has 4 players to score

BLAZING AROUND THE BASE PATHS

After stealing a program-best 198 bases in 2007, Union is about to surpass that mark this season. The Bulldogs have swiped 197 bases in 227 attempts this season and leads the NAIA in stolen bases per game at 3.127.

Joe Grinstead leads the team with 46 swipes, while Kenny Kysar is next in line with 38. Lionez Henriquez has stolen 35, and David Fairbanks and C.R. Berry have 20 and 19 stolen bases, respectively.

FAIRBANKS IS A GAMER

Senior left fielder David Fairbanks has played in more games than any other Bulldog in program history. Heading into the NAIA World Series, the Cincinnati, Ohio native has played in 222 games, surpassing the previous mark of 202 - held by Josh Smith.

During his five years with the Bulldogs - he missed the entire 2006 season due to an injury, Fairbanks' offensive numbers have drastically improved. After batting .238 and .253 during his first two seasons, Fairbanks batted .345 in 2007 and is currently hitting .356 this season - giving him a .309 career batting average.

POSSIBLE REUNION WITH A FORMER COACH

Senior right hander Marcus White and sophomore outfielder Dustin Thrasher could possibly find themselves staring across the diamond at their former coach. Both players played at Indiana Tech under Randy Stegall, who is now the head coach for No. 6 seed Embry-Riddle (Fla.) University.

CALLING THE BULLPEN

Junior relievers Chaz Bargo and Russell Logsdon have been called in from the bullpen. Bargo, a right hander, leads the way with 24 relief appearances while Logsdon, a left hander, is next in line with 20 relief appearances.

record with 65. Greg Bruce held the mark at 64. Bargo needs four more relief appearances to set the relief appearances record - which is also held by Bruce at 64.

Bargo is 1-5 with a 3.94 ERA and 4 saves. He also has 27 strikeouts and 12 walks. Logsdon is 4-1 with a 4.14 ERA with two saves, 27 strikeouts and 9 walks.

RACKING UP THE WINS

In only his fifth season, Union head coach Bart Osborne has taken the Bulldog program to new heights. On April 12, he became the winningest coach in program history with win No. 198. Currently, Osborne is 213-87 for a .710 winning percentage.

Union has also won 40 or more games

the last four seasons, including a 48-win season in 2006. Union has won 40 or more five times in program history.

Union currently has pieced together 13 winning seasons in a row and has won 30 or more games in a season 11 times.

NINE IS USUALLY ENOUGH

Union has is 27-2 when scoring 9 or more runs. Both of the loses have come during the postseason. The first was a 14-13 defeat to Tennessee Wesleyan in the Appalachian Athletic Conference Tournament championship game. The second as a 10-9 loss to Cumberland (Tenn.) University in the first game of the South Central Super Regional.



HEAD COACH BART OSBORNE



Bart Osborne became the head coach of the Union College baseball program in July of 2003, making him the seventh person to hold the post since the sport was reinstated at the school in 1974.

Osborne has compiled a 166-71 record during his first four seasons at Union, which included a 48-win season in 2006 to set the program record for wins in a season. In addition, the Bulldogs have posted a 61-29 record in Appalachian Athletic Conference play under Osborne and won the 2006 Appalachian Athletic Conference Tournament.

Union reached new heights in 2007 as it won the NAIA Region XII Tournament for the first time in program history and hosted the South Central Super Regional.

During his tenure, Osborne has produced seven NAIA All-American Honorable Mentions, 11 NAIA Region XII All-Region Team players, 15 First Team All-Conference selections, the 2006 Appalachian Athletic Conference Player and Freshman of the Year and the 2005 Appalachian Athletic Conference Pitcher of the Year. In addition, Union had a player named the NAIA Player of the Year once in 2006 and a pitcher named the NAIA Pitcher of the Week twice in 2005. The Bulldogs have placed 20 players on the Academic All-Conference Team and seven have been named Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

Prior to coming to Union, Osborne spent the past six years as an assistant coach at Murray State University. While there, Murray State made postseason tournament appearances every season and won the 2003 Ohio Valley Conference tournament championship. In addition, Murray State has produced 19 All-Conference team members, broken 16 offensive school records and raised its conference winning percentage from 39 percent to 51 percent.

Before coaching at Murray State, Osborne spent three seasons at Southeast Missouri State University as an assistant, was the head coach at Kirby High (Tenn.) School for two years and served as a graduate assistant at Delta State (Miss.) University for two seasons.

He received his Bachelor's degree from Middle Tennessee State University and his Master's from Delta State. Osborne played at Roane State (Tenn.) Community College, helping it win the state championship in 1987 and was the team captain in 1988.

Osborne is married, and he and his wife, Julie, have two daughters - Addison and Leanna, and a son - R.J.

ASSISTANT COACH ADAM HINES

Adam Hines is in his fourth year as the assistant coach of the Union College baseball team, serving as the team's pitching coach.

During his first season, Union had one of the top pitching staffs in the NAIA. The Bulldogs rated in the top 20 in seven of nine pitching categories. Union ranked fourth in Team ERA (3.03), 10th in Strikeouts Per Game (6.14), 14th in Total Strikeouts (356)

19th in Walked Batters Per Game (2.71), 13th in Runs Allowed Per Game (3.84), 17th in Total Runs Allowed (223), and 11th in Hits Per Game Allowed (6.88).

Prior to coming to Union, Hines spent the four years (2001-0) as the head baseball coach at Southeastern Illinois College. In all, he spent five seasons on the coaching staff at Southeastern Illinois as he spent the 2000 season as an assistant.

Union College entered the Appalachian Athletic Conference as the No. 2 seed and battled its way to the championship round before falling to top-seeded Tennessee Wesleyan College 14-13.

Here's complete coverage of Union's march to the tournament championship round.

Union 8, Bluefield 1 - April 30

KINGSPORT, Tenn. - No. 15 Union College jumped out to an early lead before cruising to an 8-1 victory over seventh-seeded Bluefield (Va.) College in the opening round of the Appalachian Athletic Conference Tournament Wednesday at Hunter Wright Stadium in Kingsport, Tenn.

The second-seeded Bulldogs reeled off four runs in the first and never looked back as junior left-hander Lance Dougherty (Canyon, Texas) tossed his first complete game of the season, allowing one run on six hits and no walks. Dougherty also fanned two batters in improving his record to 7-1.

Union (38-12 overall) now moves on to face King (Tenn.) College in the next round at 9 a.m. Friday. No. 3 King defeated No. 6 Milligan (Tenn.) College 4-3 earlier in the day.

Bluefield (32-15 overall) drops to the losers' bracket to take on Milligan at 12 p.m. in Bristol, Tenn.

While Dougherty shined on the mound, Joe Grinstead (Bowling Green, Ky.) took care of business at the plate in going 3-for-5 with two doubles, three RBIs and runs scored.

Grinstead got the scoring started in the first with a two-run double. Two batters later, Josh Ehringer (Somerset, Ky.) belted a two-run home run. The four-bagger was the 12th of the season for Ehringer and the 20th for his career.

Andrew Murray launched a solo shot for Bluefield in the second, but Union scored two more in the fourth and one more in the fifth for a 7-1 advantage. In the eighth, Justin Hart (Lake Mary, Fla.) cranked a solo home run to make the final 8-1. The home run was Hart's sixth of the season and 14th of his career.

Ehringer finished the game going 2-for-5 with two RBIs and a run scored, while Lioney Henriquez (Brooklyn, N.Y.) was 2-for-5 with two runs scored and a RBI. In fact, all nine Union batters collected at least one hit as the team rapped out 13 base knocks.

For Bluefield, Murray was the only multi-hit player as he finished 2-for-4 with the home run.

Billie Mueller got the start for the Rams but lasted only one inning. Ken Misal pitched well in relief, going eight innings and giving up four runs, three earned, on seven hits and seven walks with six strikeouts.

Union 5, King 1 - May 1

KINGSPORT, Tenn. - Union College junior Marty Popham weaved another masterpiece Thursday as the second-seed Bulldogs advanced to the winners' bracket final with a 5-1 decision over No. 3 seed King (Tenn.) College in the Appalachian Athletic Conference Tournament.

Popham gave up a season-high 10 hits but was able to get out of numerous jams as he tossed his ninth complete game and matched his season high for strikeouts with 11. The Louisville, Ky. native set the single-season program record for wins as he improved to 13-1 on the season and now boasts 103 strikeouts as compared to 17 walks in 88 1/3 innings pitched.

Union (39-12 overall) will now face the winner of the Tennessee Wesleyan College game Friday at 11:30 a.m. in the winners' bracket finale. Tennessee Wesleyan defeated UVa-Wise 9-4 in its second-round game Friday.

Joe Grinstead (Bowling Green, Ky.) manufactured a run for Union in the bottom of the first as he lined a two-out single. After stealing second, he advanced to third on an error and scored thanks to a Benny Fuller wild pitch.

Union missed a golden opportunity to add to its 1-0 lead in the second as it loaded the bases with no outs. However, David Fairbanks (Cincinnati, Ohio) lined out to shortstop Drew Trujillo, who doubled up Matt Brady (Louisville, Ky.) at second. After a walk reloaded the bases, Fuller got out of the jam as Kenny Kysar (Corbin, Ky.) hit into a fielder's choice to leave it a one-run game.

In the fourth, Kysar came through with a two-out, two-run double to give Union a 3-0 advantage.

After a number of missed opportunities, King finally cracked the scoring column in the sixth as Trujillo lined a two-run single just out of the reach of a leaping Lioney Henriquez (Brooklyn, N.Y.) at second to plate a run. Pinch-hitter Bryan Cruze followed a line drive of his own, but first baseman Trey Wheeler (Hopkinsville, Ky.) snared it out of the air for the third out, leaving the score at 3-1.

Earlier in the game, Wheeler made a spectacular defensive play when he crashed into the fence to haul in a foul ball by Craig Cant, pulling it out of the stands in the second inning.

In the bottom of the sixth, Union loaded the bases with one out when Henriquez lined a single up the middle to drive in Fairbanks, making it a 4-1 contest. However, the threat ended there as Grinstead bounced into an inning-ending double play.

Union added an insurance run as it took advantage of a King error. With two down and runners on the corners, Grinstead singled to center to knock in Dustin Thrasher (Somerset, Ky.) for a 5-1 Union lead.

Fairbanks and Grinstead each went 2-for-4 at the plate with Fairbanks scoring twice. Grinstead stole two bases, scored once and drove in a run.

Four King (30-15 overall) players had two hits off Popham as the Tornadoes outhit Union 10-9. However, four King errors and six walks to the Bulldogs did not help things for the Tornadoes.

Tennessee Wesleyan 8, Union 5 - May 2 - Winners' Bracket Final

KINGSPORT, Tenn. - One can almost always count on an exciting game when Union College and Tennessee Wesleyan College tangle on the diamond, and Friday's contest did not disappoint as top-seeded Tennessee Wesleyan pulled out an 8-5 decision in the winners' bracket finale of the 2008 Appalachian Athletic Conference Tournament.

With the victory, Tennessee Wesleyan (40-15 overall) advances to the championship game, set for Saturday at 10:30 a.m. Union will face the winner of the King (Tenn.) College-UVa-Wise game Friday at 6:30 p.m. for the right to take on Tennessee Wesleyan for the title.

Tied at 5-5, Union appeared it was going to seize control of the game when it loaded the bases with one out in the bottom of the eighth. However, Lioney Henriquez (Brooklyn, N.Y.) grounded the ball to Vladimir Frias at short, who throw home for an out and catcher Dean McDermond then threw to first to complete the double play and end the threat.

Pumped by getting out of the jam, Tennessee Wesleyan had a runner on second with one out when Gary Tucker singled to left, scoring Kevin Carby for the go-ahead run. Another Union error allowed Tennessee Wesleyan to push across another run for a 7-5 advantage.

Tyler Moyneur was then hit by a pitch to force in a run, making it 8-5.

Errors plagued Union (39-13 overall) as five errors resulted in six unearned runs for Tennessee Wesleyan. Tennessee Wesleyan managed to line one more hit than Union with a 10-9 edge in that category.

In addition, both teams' pitchers struggled with control as there was seven combined walks - one intentional, and nine hit batters.

Union drew first blood as it loaded the bases with two outs in the bottom of the second. Kenny Kysar (Corbin, Ky.) hit a slow roller to short for an infield hit, allowing Matt Brady (Louisville, Ky.) to give Union a 1-0 lead.

KINGSPORT, Tenn. - No. 2 seed Union College survived a test of wills against fifth-seeded UVa-Wise Friday, winning 8-7 to advance to the championship game of the 2008 Appalachian Athletic Conference Baseball Tournament at Hunter Wright Stadium in Kingsport, Tenn.

The win was also the 40th for the Bulldogs, marking the fourth year in a row and fifth overall they have registered 40 wins in a season.

Union (40-13 overall) will now face top-seeded Tennessee Wesleyan College Saturday at 11 a.m. for the championship.

Despite posting eight runs, Union only generated five base hits. The UVa-Wise pitching staff helped out with nine walks - two intentional, and one hit batter. UVa-Wise (29-21 overall) outhit Union 13-5.

UVa-Wise cracked the scoring column first as Mike Lang and Brad Austin lined run-scoring hits in the third, making it a 2-0 contest. Union cut the deficit in half in the bottom of the third thanks to a Kenny Kysar (Corbin, Ky.) RBI single.

KINGSPORT, Tenn. - In what turned out to be a war of attrition, top-seeded Tennessee Wesleyan College held on for a 14-13 victory over No. 2 seed Union College, capturing the 2008 Appalachian Athletic Conference Baseball Tournament at Hunter Wright Stadium in Kingsport, Tenn., Saturday.

The two teams combined for 27 runs, 26 hits, nine extra-base hits, six errors, 11 walks, four hit batters and two balks in what resulted in a wild affair.

Neither team had more than a four-run lead, and there were just two innings in which neither team scored.

Union struck first, posting four runs in the top of the first. Kenny Kysar (Corbin, Ky.) and Lioney Henriquez (Brooklyn, N.Y.) led off with back-to-back singles. After moving up a base on a sac bunt, both scored when Justin Hart (Lake Mary, Fla.) reached on an error. KINGSPORT, Tenn. - Senior third baseman Matt Brady notched a season-high five RBIs Wednesday as No. 2 seed Union College won its NAIA Region XII Tournament opener 6-1 over fifth-seeded Indiana University Southeast.

The double-elimination tournament is being held at Hunter Wright Stadium in Kingsport, Tenn.

Union (41-14 overall) will now face the winner of the game between UVa-Wise and King (Tenn.) College Thursday at 12 p.m. Indiana Southeast (31-22) will next face the loser of the game between Tennessee Wesleyan College and Brescia (Ky.) University Thursday at 7 p.m.

Brady (Louisville, Ky.) went 2-for-4 and drove in five runs, joining Justin Hart (Lake Mary, Fla.) as the only Bulldogs to record five RBIs in a game this season. Hart accomplished the feat in an 18-7 win over University of the Cumberlands (Ky.) on March 26.

Indiana Southeast drew first blood as Brandon Hogan delivered a run-scoring single in the first.

It remained 1-0 until the fifth inning when Trey Wheeler (Hopkinsville, Ky.) singled in pinch-runner C.R. Berry (Roark, Ky.) in the fifth.

Indiana Southeast starting pitcher Brad Nickles was perfect through the first four innings, but Hart's leadoff single snapped the perfect game.

Union (46-16 overall) and Cumberland (46-20 overall) will meet for a winner-take-all showdown Friday at 2 p.m. at Ernest L. Stockton Field in Lebanon, Tenn.

On Wednesday, Cumberland pulled out the 10-9 victory thanks to a Nick Jiles three-run home run. Union turned the tables as Joe Grinstead (Bowling Green, Ky.) belted a three-run blast in the seventh to put Union up for good.

Popham (Louisville, Ky.) didn't have his usual pinpoint control as he walked a season-high five batters and struck out just six. Still, he limited Cumberland to three runs, all earned, on nine hits as he improved to 16-1 in collecting his 12th complete game this season. Popham's earned-run average is now 2.03 and he has 124 strikeouts and 27 walks in program-record 115 1/3 innings pitched.

Down 3-1 in the seventh, Union had two on with no one out when Grinstead belted a three-run home run down the right-field line to put Union up one. Brett McAlpin (Winchester, Ky.) added a RBI single to make it 5-3.

Cumberland had a golden opportunity to cut the deficit or even tie the game in the bottom of the eighth as it loaded the bases with two outs. However, Popham struck out Brian Lucas to end the inning unscathed.

In the ninth, Popham struck out Austin Morgan to start the inning, but he walked Blake Simmons on five pitches. But that's where the threat ended as Popham got James Lilley to end the game by hitting into a double play as Union won the game 5-3 and even the series at one game apiece.

Union had its chances to score all day but failed to come through with many clutch hits as he had 15 base knocks and stranded 11 men on base. Union also grounded into three double plays.

On the flip side, Cumberland had nine hits and left seven men stranded while bouncing into four twin killings.

Cumberland drew first blood in the bottom of the third when Lilley singled in Morgan with one out. Union tied the game in fourth thanks to a David Fairbanks (Cincinnati, Ohio) run-scoring single.

Jason Bush, though, led off the bottom of the fourth with a solo home run, putting Cumberland up 2-1. Cumberland made a 3-1 ballgame when Will Curry lofted a two-out single down the right-field line to drive in Tyler Fisher.

The game remained 3-1 until Union's four-run outburst in the seventh en route to the 5-3 decision.

Grinstead finished the game 3-for-4 with a double three RBIs, needing only a triple for they cycle. When he scored on his home run, Grinstead set the single-season record for runs scored as he has now crossed the plate 74 times. He also stole a base, tying him with Tim Galbraith for that single-season record at 46.

Fairbanks went 2-for-3 with a RBI, while McAlpin was 2-for-4 with a RBI. Lioney Henriquez (Brooklyn, N.Y.) ended the game 2-for-5 with a run scored.

Bush was the only Cumberland player to have multiple hits as he went 3-for-4 with a RBI and run scored.

Eric Spivey suffered the loss, giving up five runs - four earned, on 14 hits and two walks with four punchouts

Union 4, Cumberland 1 - May 15 - Game 3

LEBANON, Tenn. - Union College punched its ticket to the Avista-NAIA World Series as it won the NAIA South Central Super Regional, defeating host Cumberland (Tenn.) University 4-1 Friday to the best-of-three series two games to one.

The victory sends Union to its first-ever NAIA World Series and is only the third school from Kentucky to ever advance that far, joining Georgetown (Ky.) College and Spalding (Ky.) University in that category.

"This was a 24-man effort here today," said Union head coach Bart Osborne. "Lance (Dougherty) threw great and all the guys just did there job.

"This is just unimaginable for me. To beat such a classy and tradition-rich program like the one Woody Hunt runs here at Cumberland is amazing."

The Avista-NAIA World Series will be held in Lewiston, Idaho, May 23-30. Pairings will be announced Sunday.

In addition to his current 24-man roster, Osborne credits the past few senior classes for getting the program to this point.

"This win today is just as much about the guys on the field as the last couple classes that have come through here," the fifth-year coach said. "This has been a five-year process, and the teams that have preceded this one deserve credit for building what Union baseball has become."

Union (47-16 overall) collected the victory and World Series berth by playing small ball and taking advantage of a pair of Cumberland (46-21 overall) errors. Union didn't necessarily hit the ball hard but rather in the right spots. Also, Union burned up the base paths, stealing four bases - three in the first inning alone.

David Fairbanks (Cincinnati, Ohio) was the offensive star as he had to fill in as the lead-off hitter as Kenny Kysar (Corbin, Ky.) was scratched after being injured in Thursday's game. Fairbanks went 2-for-3 with two runs scored and two stolen bases.

"I just had to step up," Fairbanks said. "When Kenny went down and I was told I'd be batting leadoff, I knew I just had to step up and set the tempo."

For the super regional, Fairbanks batted .556 with three runs scored and two RBIs.

Union struck first as Fairbanks led off the bottom of the first by reaching on an error. After stealing second and third, Fairbanks strolled home thanks to a Justin Hart (Lake Mary, Fla.) sac fly.

In the top of the second, Zack Diekmann led off with a double to left center and later scored when Tyler Fisher lined a double, tying the score at 1-1.

Lioney Henriquez (Brooklyn, N.Y.) put Union back on top in the bottom off the fifth as he lofted a two-out single to center, allowing Fairbanks to score easily from second.

Union added an insurance run in the seventh when pinch-runner Tyler Martin (Corbin, Ky.) scored off of a Dustin Thrasher (Somerset, Ky.) sac fly, making it a 3-1

contest. It appeared that Union might add even more runs as it loaded the bases with two outs, but second baseman James Lilley made a nice leaping catch to save a couple runs on a Joe Grinstead (Bowling Green, Ky.) line drive to end the threat.

In the eighth, Brett McAlpin (Winchester, Ky.) lined a two-out double to left center to drive in a run for a 4-1 cushion.

McAplin stepped big time in the super regional, leading the team with a .583 average, two doubles and five RBIs.

"I was looking fastball," McAplin said of his last run-scoring hit. "It felt good to put that extra run on the board for insurance."

Lance Dougherty (Canyon, Texas) tossed a 1-2-3 ninth inning with Thrasher making a diving catch for the third and final out, sealing the 4-1 victory.

Dougherty went the distance, allowing one earned run on five hits and one walk with four strikeouts. He is now 8-1 on the year with a 2.52 earned-run average.

"This was a team effort. I don't strike a lot of guys out, so it took the eight guys behind me to get the job done," Dougherty said.
